Public Comments

Hank Ryan (Jenks Resident)

- Jenks is not doing anything to help mitigate the pandemic
- Says he and the company he runs will not be doing any business with Jenks businesses because of this

Marry Newman (Tulsa resident, son works in Jenks)

- Disappointed that there is no mask mandate
- Masks not only help keep Jenks safe, but Tulsa too
- A mask mandate takes courage & shows leadership, which is much needed in Oklahoma.

John Peters (PO Box 1013)

- Opposes mask requirement
- Feels like it should be left to the citizens
- Business will lose out if we require mask, as people are already leaving Tulsa to shop because of their mask ordinance

Veronica Hurdelbrink (715 W Main)
